SHELDON WARD DEVELOPMENT PLAN

SHELDON WARD

Sheldon is an outer suburb on the south east side of Birmingham, reached by the A45 Coventry Road. It is bounded by Solihull to the south and east and the main London railway line, Garretts Green Lane and Coventry Road to the west. The Northern end of the runway at Birmingham International Airport lies in the Ward, although the airport itself is actually in neighbouring Solihull. Hatchford Brook Golf Centre is adjacent to the runway.

- According to the 2001 Population Census there were **20,129** people resident in Sheldon.
- The area is **5.8 square KM** in size, with a population density of **3,481 people per square KM**, this compares with 3,649 people per square KM for Birmingham.
- **20.8%** of people were aged under 16, **53.8%** were aged between 16 and 59, while **25.4%** were aged over 60. The average age was **40.5**, compared with 36 years for Birmingham.
- The minority ethnic population made up **5.9% (1,195)** of the ward's population, compared with 29.6% for Birmingham.
- **71.9%** of households were owner occupied and **21.3%** were rented from either the local authority, housing association or other registered social landlord. The remaining **6.8%** of households rented privately or lived rent free.
- The Census found that **9,149 (66.7%)** of the population aged 16 to 74 were working or seeking work, this compared with 60.4% for Birmingham.

A large percentage of the owner-occupied housing is semi-detached three bedroomed built in the 1930s. Two and three bedroomed council housing was added post war, much of which has been sold over the last 20 years. The remaining Council owned housing comprises of small bungalows, blocks of flats and maisonettes.

The ward has one secondary school offering dual use as a leisure centre, one Roman Catholic Primary School and four other primary schools. There is a Public Library and the ward is served by Sheldon Neighbourhood Office which also accommodates the Yardley Constituency Office. There are also two Youth and Community Centres within the ward.

Sheldon is also home to the Sheldon Country Park an area of natural parkland with associated farm buildings and animals.

Rail: Lea Hall and Marston Green Stations lie outside, but adjacent to, the Ward.

WARD DEVELOPMENT PLAN

The Ward Development Plan looks at the important challenges facing the ward and the specific concerns of local residents. The plan then looks at how these challenges and concerns can be tackled who needs to be involved, what resources are needed, who should take lead responsibility and timescales.

Information contained in the plan has been gathered together from the last development plan, from the Ward Conference, from the Ward Advisory Board and Ward Committee meetings, from the local Health Authority, the local Police, the local Councillors, officers of the City Council and local residents.

The development plan is a useful guide to help groups, agencies and Birmingham City Council work together towards improving Sheldon.

NEIGHBOURHOOD RENEWAL FUND

The Neighbourhood Renewal Fund is a new five year initiative intended to make improvements in public services, in such a way as to have a positive impact and improved outcomes in the more deprived areas of Sheldon. It aims to ensure that the public, voluntary and community resources come together to tackle those issues of most concern in local areas. The fund is now into its second year.

In particular, the fund will address the disadvantages of geographical communities which suffer from poor housing and physical environments and rates of crime, poor health, unemployment and education achievement which are markedly worse than the rest of the country. The shaded areas on the map identify those Enumeration Districts within Sheldon that are within the most deprived 25% in the country.

Implementing the Fund will mean a reform of key local public services by managing those services locally, being more responsive to community needs and working together to meet those needs.

The role of the Ward Committee is to oversee the Neighbourhood Renewal allocation in Sheldon; it is the hub of the decision-making arrangements ensuring a clear and transparent process by which all decisions are taken in public. The committee seeks a partnership approach to improving Sheldon working together with local service providers and key community groups via the Ward Advisory Board and involving partner agencies such as the Health Authority, Birmingham Voluntary Services Council and West Midlands Police.

The Ward Committee wishes to ensure that all possible neighbourhoods that could benefit from the Ward allocation are considered when the areas proposed reflect and satisfy local knowledge of need or satisfy a ward priority of Community Safety. The Ward Development Plan is used to identify local needs and priorities.

Sheldon Ward has an allocation of £100,585 in each of the five years.

SHELDON WARD COMMITTEE

The Sheldon Ward Committee meets every two months and gives local people a chance to have their say and get involved in improving their neighbourhood. The Ward Committee will also discuss the progress of the actions identified in the development plan.
