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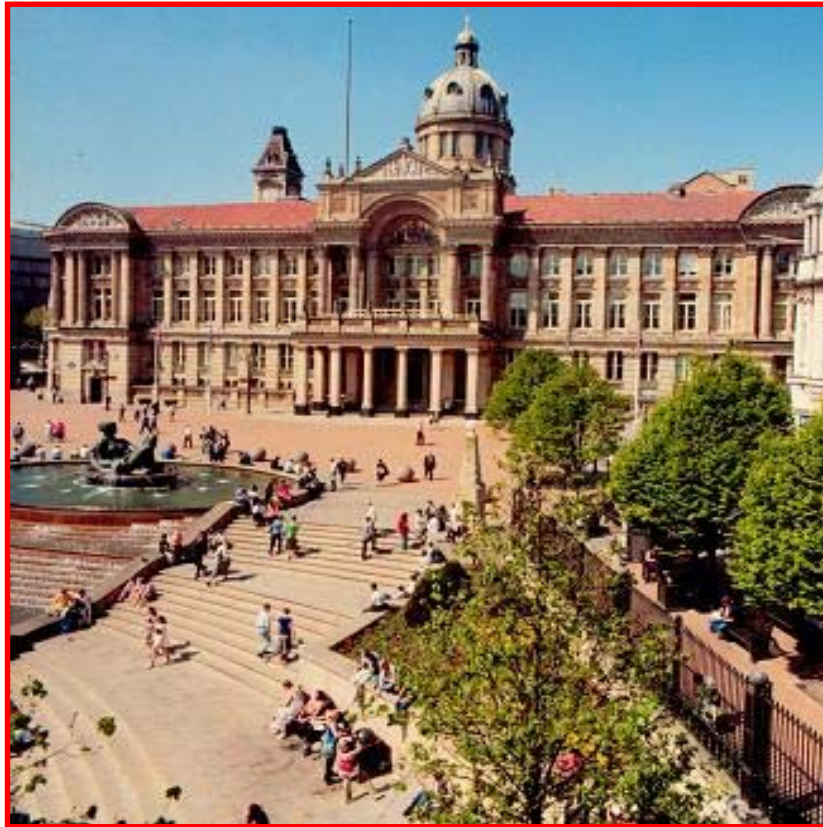

- Mark the NHF's Supported Housing Month






Outcomes: At a European level
