

INDEX OF MULTIPLE DEPRIVATION 2010

Crime Domain


The Crime Domain measures the incidence of recorded crime for four major crime themes, representing the likelihood of personal and material victimisation at a local level.

This domain has the fewest SOAs in Birmingham classified in the most deprived 25% in England. Under 40% of the SOAs are ranked in the worst quarter in England. The 17 ranked in the most deprived 5% are in the wards of Soho, Shard End, Stechford and Yardley North, Sparkbrook, Nechells, Ladywood, Weoley and Selly Oak. All wards have some SOAs in the lower level of deprivation, with the exception of Sutton Four Oaks and Hall Green.

Comparison with 2004 and 2007

The number of SOAs in the most deprived categories has fallen since 2004, now under 40% are ranked in the most deprived 25% compared with over 53% in 2004. 33 SOAs were ranked in the most deprived 5% in 2004 and this has decreased to 17 by 2010, 8 of which have been ranked in this category in all three years. 8 SOAs have become relatively less deprived in 2010 as they are no longer in the worst 5% but 5 have moved the other way into the most deprived 5%.


Figure 1: Number of Most Deprived SOAs in the Crime Domain, 2004, 2007 and 2010

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Variables used in this domain:

- ◆ Burglary per 1000 at risk households (4 recorded crime offence types, Police Force data for April 2008-March 2009, constrained to Crime and Disorder Reduction Partnership (CDRP) level)
- ◆ Theft per 1000 at risk population (5 recorded crime offence types, Police Force data for April 2008-March 2009, constrained to CDRP level)
- ◆ Criminal damage per 1000 at risk population (11 recorded crime offence types, Police Force data for April 2008-March 2009, constrained to CDRP level)
- ◆ Violence per 1000 at risk population (19 recorded crime offence types, Police Force data for April 2008-March 2009, constrained to CDRP level)
